Mission Alive Project – Prong Two – Being Providence People

Editor's Note: Pittsburgh Associate Judi Boone contributes to our 2014-15 Mission Alive Project, the third in our series.

In a recent conversation with Pat Montgomery, I was reminded of our Mission Alive Project. After I had shared some of the activities I had been doing the week before, she said "You are growing where you have been planted!" I have been "planted" in St. Sylvester's parish in Brentwood, PA.

A few years ago I started to feel a deeper pull toward the teaching and service of the Church. I shared this with our Deacon, Andy White. He validated what I said, told me about his own entrance into the diaconate, and encouraged me to focus on these feelings. So I did; it proved to be the push I needed.

Then, Sr. Marilyn McMillan, CDP, came into my life and the path opened up even more. My studies led me to where I am today. I kept being presented with opportunities to serve and I took them as they came. What tremendous gifts I have been given!!

I became a lector the moment Deacon Andy came to the pew I was sitting in on a Sunday morning and said, "Come on, we need a lector." Then Fr. John asked me to

lector during the week -- at 8:00 Mass on Tuesday and Thursday. I became a Eucharistic Minister and am blessed with frequent opportunities to do this since St. Sylvester's has a small group of people who serve as Eucharistic ministers at Jefferson Hospital. This led to yet another opportunity for me with Pastoral care director, Rev. Dr. Paul Edwards.

A local care center, also associated with St. Sylvester's ministry, needed someone to lead the Rosary.

Once a week I do that and every Monday afternoon with few exceptions, I lead a prayer and Communion service for the residents. During Lent we say the Stations of the Cross every Friday.

For the past eight years I have joined in recitation of the rosary, and now I am the leader. St. Sylvester's has a weekly Bible study group that I have been a part of for the past four years; it is a wonderful group of people with two excellent leaders.

The Lord has made use of my nursing skills by allowing me to care for parishioners with needs. Some have had cancer; some have taken falls and sustained injuries; some just need a person "to be there." Along with all of this has come the friendship and warmth of a wonderful group of people. They are the flowers in this garden where I am growing. *Judi Boone, Associate*

4. Donations can be made using your credit card:
 - a. Call Mission Advancement at (412) 635-5401 with your credit card information, or
 - b. Use the website, cdpsisters.org, to donate online (Support Us/Donate Now)
 - c. Designate your donation for the Associate Relationship
 - d. If you want to make monthly recurring donations, inform Mission Advancement when you call, or indicate your donation as recurring when you donate through the website
5. Donations can be made electronically from your bank account. Follow your bank's instructions regarding how to indicate Associate Relationship on the check's memo line or call Mission Advancement to let the office staff know your designation.
6. Whether donating by check, phone or online, designate the donation as Associate Relationship.
7. After receipt of your donations, your record is updated and IRS thank you letters are sent.
