SISTER AMBROSE MATT, like Mother Marie you had a motherly love for your students and treated them all as being important, teaching them through your kindness to love Jesus as their best friend, and to do all they do with the “good intention,” *We ask you to help us discover the presence of Jesus in all we experience in life through our “good intentions.”* (11-27-57)

SISTER LOUISE AMON, you were a great example of poverty and simplicity to your sisters, *We pray that your love for these virtues endow us with a love for the simple way of life.* (7-1-58)
