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What is our image of St. Joseph?

Is St. Joseph a man of our time, giving us an example for our life today? We hear in the first reading the prophesy given to David: "When your time comes and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your heir after you." Joseph follows the prophecy and his faith. He travels to Bethlehem, to David's house. Can we see him beside and with our Muslim Sisters and Brothers who want to follow their faith?

Joseph, a young man who is in love with Mary, but hears that she is pregnant. What should he do? The Scripture tells us, "he was a just man following the law, but he did not want to shame her." He was in doubt. The law says: 'Stoning, Kill her, abortion.' We can feel his deep distress, his questions, his desperation. How many women and men must make difficult decisions? Joseph is with them.
