on the second prong of our Mission Alive Project
for 2014: Contributing to our own local "missions"
in our own ways. This is Candice Martin's response
to that invitation. Please consider sending yours!

I have been working as a volunteer for Note in the Pocket Ministry for almost two years now. When asked if I had any time to help out, I quickly answered yes.

It all started when I lost my job, and didn't have many prospects of getting a new one. I really needed something

to do to not only keep my mind occupied, but also to help other people less fortunate than myself. Little did I know at that time that volunteering for this ministry would strengthen my faith in God and help me to realize how blessed I really was.

This ministry focuses on providing decent clothes for needy school children, which in turn provides the recipients with dignity and a chance to fit in with their classmates. There are over 4000 children in my county in need of clothing and food and this ministry has been able to provide for all of them so far.

According to their website, "Note in the Pocket grew out of a family ministry started in 2005. One family took it upon themselves to provide clothing for some children in an impoverished school. As word spread, more people became interested in helping and more needs were identified. In the spring of 2012, this family ministry became a ministry of Our Lady of Lourdes, operating under their nonprofit status. In March of 2013, Note in the Pocket became a legally formed

I became aware of Note in the Pocket's strong dedication to its mission when we participated in the Activate Raleigh 9/11 service day. We worked with over 30 corporate volunteers, showing them what goes into preparing

clothing donations before they even reach the kids.

All of the volunteers that I have met have been very understanding and caring for those less fortunate. I feel very blessed to be a part of this wonderful ministry and look forward to continuing in the future volunteering and sharing my faith with other people.
