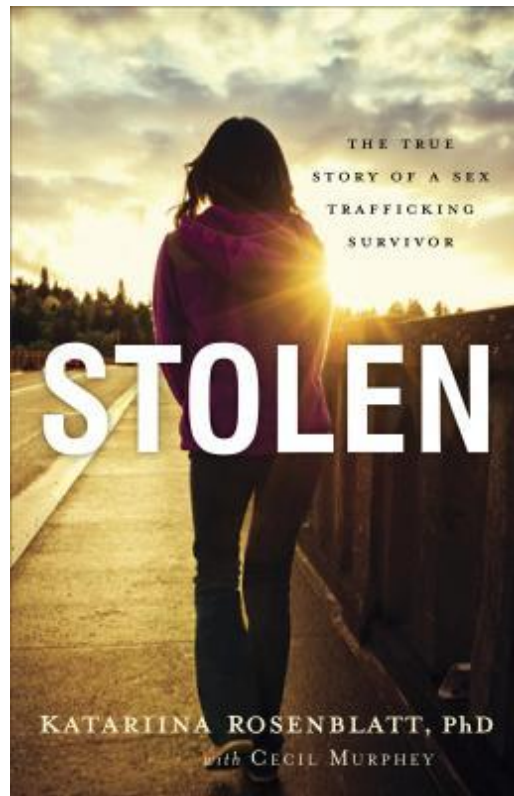

Dr. Rosenblatt's story is on display in the National Museum for Civil Rights in Atlanta, GA. She is part of the Federal Speaker's Bureau as well as a featured speaker at the National Survivor Leader Forum in Washington, DC, where only a few selected survivor leaders are chosen annually to speak to every federal agency nationwide through the Office of Victims of Crime (OVC) on the issue of human trafficking. An accomplished author with published articles on domestic violence and human trafficking, Dr. Rosenblatt is asked regularly to work with and to consult on cases with local and federal law enforcement authorities across the nation such as the FBI & Department of Homeland Security. She also served as the survivor liaison for the 11th Judicial Human Trafficking Task Force Court and founded a survivor-to-survivor outreach and mentoring program called, There Is H.O.P.E. For Me, which provides her specialized brand of survivor leader mentoring and support nationwide. She authors two books, Trafficking in America - The Most Undetected Human Rights Violation of Our Time, published by Lambert Academic Publishers and Stolen - The True Story of a Sex Trafficking Survivor, published by Baker Books. Dr. Katariina Rosenblatt holds an LL.M in intercultural human rights law and a PhD.
